# **Menu of Positive Reinforcements**

It is important to have a classroom plan for providing frequent positive feedback to students as they follow guidelines for success and demonstrate good behavior. *Strive for at least four positive interactions to each negative!* Use your BEST language and expectations in both positive and negative consequences. Reinforcement must be important and meaningful to the child. A reinforcement hierarchy allows the student to choose the level of award that is meaningful to him or her. Here are some possibilities for celebrating success:

#### **Schoolwide Rewards**

- 1. Citizenship award
- 2. Recognize citizenship award recipients at the end-of-year
- 3. Honors board recognize students
- 4. Lunch with the principal.
- 5. Institute a "Random Acts of Kindness" program that gives awards for spontaneous good acts.
- 6. Display photos of students of the month for each class on a bulletin board.
- 7. Have a "Citizen of the Week (or Month)" announced by the principal.
- 8. Special privileges (e.g. sports event, ice cream passes, etc.). Include anecdotes of commendable student behavior in the school newspaper.
- 9. Give the morning announcements.
- 10. Send home cards of praise to recognize students who demonstrate good behavior.
- 11. Hold a special party for BUGS "Being Unusually Good Students" award recipients.
- 12. Set up a system under which students are given a ticket when caught demonstrating' character, these tickets can grant the student special privileges, or they can be redeemed to purchase small items.
- 13. Soccer game in nearby stadium
- 14. Slip and slide
- 15. Administrator move desk to roof/under a tree and work all day
- 16. Staff vs. Student competition (volleyball, soccer)
- 17. Video game tournament

#### **Entire Class Rewards:**

- 1. Receive an extra recess.
- 2. Show a video. (Let the students vote on which one they want to see.)
- 3. Do a special art project. (Students decide.)
- 4. Have ten minutes off free time.
- 5. Listen to music during work period.
- 6. Watch a television show.
- 7. Have a popcorn party.
- 8. Enjoy a brown bag lunch.
- 9. Have an extra period in the computer lab.
- 10. Hike around school grounds.
- 11. Extend lunch period by ten minutes. (Teacher supervised.)
